If you wish to invite a member of your family to come to the United States on a B-2 visa (visitor for touristic purposes), you may wish to follow the steps below. Please keep in mind the suggested procedure is for visitor applications only.

1. Write a letter (see template below) to the nonimmigrant visa officer in which you:
 - Indicate the expected length of visit and preferred arrival date.
 - Indicate pertinent biographical information of the visitors (i.e name, relationship to you, date of birth, country of citizenship).
 - If you wish to add information regarding your graduation date.
